day the staff at Nash would greet our people and coach them in their desired activities. Each session would end with a group dance.

When the winter fitness program ended, the Park District hosted an Olympic ceremony, of sorts, at the Nash Center. The public was invited and Catherine Bohan Greene, a former Olympic swimmer representing Ireland, gave the opening remarks.

Awards were announced, trophies and flower bouquets were given to the bronze, silver and gold medalists. The audience was enthusiastic in their support. And after the ceremony, there was – again – much dancing.

For many of the participants, these Thursday mornings were the highlight of their winter. But, as I've been told by some of the staff at the Park District, it was the highlight of their winter, too. The joy which our men and women showed in competing each week was refreshing and uplifting to those who work there.

Starting last spring Crest Foods has invited us to bring work crews to help them package food. It started with just a couple days a week and eventually grew to us supplying workers there daily. Our men and women



love going to Crest and challenging themselves to break their old production records. Crest loves having us. Again, what's often referenced most is the enthusiasm our people bring to the work. In the next week, we and Crest will be celebrating with a first anniversary party.

Until the rise of the pandemic, a small group of men and women from the Village would go to the Oregon Living and Rehab Center every few weeks to do craft projects with the residents. We've been told that some residents who declined to engage in any group activities would nonetheless look forward to doing a craft with the people from the Village.

A couple life lessons I learned in seminary seem to apply here. First – emotions are contagious. Angry people often raise anger in others (if you don't believe me, visit Facebook). But when you show joy, others become joyful. I think people from the Village are often welcomed by others because of the joy they bring with them. Its contagious.

A second lesson I learned is that, when grace abounds, it's hard to tell those who give from those who receive. I've seen this over and over during service projects. One group goes out to lend a hand to another that's in need. When it's over, those who went often feel that they received more than those they helped. Both parties are hard-pressed to really know who benefitted more.

At the end of the day, I believe all these groups – our Village Olympians, the Park District staff, our work crews, Crest Foods employees, the seniors at the Oregon Living Center – would say they received more than they gave. And in God's economy, that's just fine.

I'm so grateful that our staff has a front row seat to witness these things. And I'm so grateful that each of you join us on this journey.




